Hey Captain, I'm just putting my boat in the water for the summer season. How do I know what to check so I don't have any problems all summer long?

Your objective of not having any problems all summer long is noble, but don't feel like a failure if an issue arises despite all your best efforts. I think the only way to assure zero problems is to use your boat for zero hours.

Building a spring check out list is an excellent tool. I used the word "building" for several reasons. Your list should be constructed according to your specific craft and type of use. You should also consider this an ongoing project. Experience and imagination will probably change your list every year.

If you already have a list, consider how often each item should be done. For instance, you might check your mast fittings every month with a pair of binoculars and do a close up inspection every five years. A check off box by each line item is handy and double spacing is nice so you have room to write notes about more checks or follow up work that should be done.

There are a lot of good sources for building materials for your list. Your engine manual and the manual for your boat are the primary sources. Internet user groups are helpful and other owners in your area may have valuable insight. Your imagination can be a good source and the one you want to avoid is your own negative experiences. The whole idea is to learn from other peoples mistakes so you don't have to make all your own.

In the area of safety, you might want to inspect and repack inflatable life vests. If you attached a strobe and whistle inside your inflatable, make sure they are ready to go. Be sure nothing is wrapped around the vest that could cause a rupture if deployed. At least check, if not change out, the CO cylinder. Check out the date on your signaling devices even if you know they are OK. I saw flares for sale that were to expire in two months and the store had no interest in taking them off the shelf. If you have a Life Sling, clean it, repack it, make sure the line is run correctly and the knot is secure. Remember that life preserver pack in the TOP of your lazarette? Take out each preserver make sure they are clean and ready to wear. Turn each fire extinguisher upside down and shake it to be sure the powder is not compacted and check the gage to be sure the pressure is up to standard.

Have fun, think how much easier it will be next year.

The CBA motto is "...and the Spirit of God was moving over the surface of the water." Cordial Christian Ministry again does, too!




From the Sea Chest

Jesus is our Great Navigator and Our Map is His Word!

One of the last great strongholds of the enemy is the area covered by the oceans, islands and remote coastlands of the planet—one that is covered with water over two-thirds of its surface.

In the last 25 years, my wife and I have sailed over 42,000 nautical miles, crossing the major oceans and several seas in a ministry to remote peoples. We have also helped others cut loose their moorings and set their course for the Lord's service. We hope that sharing some of what we have learned helps smooth the way for waterborne ministry.

First and foremost, your relation with the Lord must be solid with good communication. Matt. 6:33 After that is settled, then ask Him if your plans to sail to faraway places is 'His idea' or yours. This is extremely important! When you are faced with trials out there, you need the assurance that He sent you and that He will look after you. Ps. 91

I firmly believe that we are in "The last days" of 'this age' and our Lord's return is very near. Anyone who is going to serve Him in remote areas needs to 'rightly judge' themselves and deal with anything that would be a foothold for the enemy. Eph. 4:27 In this regard, we have seen some who have collected artifacts and 'tikis' as they visited various islands. For the believer, these things should not be taken onboard their vessels for they become a snare to them. Deut. 7:26 Your boats need to be sanctified for the Lord's work. They are the 'battleship' and 'fortress' for you in the remote places from which you can blast 2 Cor. 10:4 the principalities, powers and strongholds. For our battle is not with flesh and blood, but with... Eph. 6:10-13 We found it very important to cover our passages and landfalls in prayer well in advance to overcome strongholds. We would also pray for the port authorities where we would be landing. We had very few problems entering the ports.

Communication by HAM or SSB radio is an important tool. We were in the edge of a hurricane (50kn winds & 20 ft. seas) and called our church on our HAM radio for more prayer. We saw the Lord quiet the wind and flatten the seas in two hours so we could make a landing inside an atoll. Many times we called for prayer and it was very effective.

Ask the Holy Spirit to give you insight as you study the Scriptures presented. We do hope that you will gain understanding and be strengthened. God bless you!
