Please join us at this historic location. There will be mission reports, praise and worship, and plenty of fellowship. Be there October 12-15, 2017.





A Word From the President



Greetings Fellow CBA Members,

It is my prayer that you are experiencing the blessings of the Lord today!

I am sure that we would all agree that there is wide spread turmoil in the world today. Almost daily we hear reports of evil happenings, murders and the like. The news media constantly reports accidents, disasters, sickness, disease, and tragedies of all kinds. There is much fear among people In This Day And This Hour”.

Recently a reporter from the weather channel asked a flood victim in Houston—who had lost everything—“Do you plan to stay here, or will you move? The man answered that there was the potential of danger everywhere—earthquakes in various places, wildfires in California, tornados in the west, hurricanes in the East—and that there was no place to go to be completely safe.

But as believers in the Lord Jesus Christ, we have a place of safety in the shelter of the Most High!

(Ps. 91:1) The Word of God tells us that we don't have to live in fear. God promises us in II Timothy 1:7 that He “has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power, of love, and a well balanced, sound mind.” (Amplified Bible)

According to Webster's dictionary fear is “a distressing emotion aroused by impending danger, evil, pain, and the like”. Whether the threat is real or imagined, the feeling or condition of being afraid usually creates emotions of apprehension, consternation, dismay, dread, terror, panic, horror, trepidation, and qualm. I John 4:18 tells us that fear has torment, battering the minds of men, women, and children with agony, anguish, annoyance, harassment, irritation, and misery.

But there is another meaning—a glorious meaning—of the word “fear” recorded in the dictionary, but first described in God's Word. This kind of fear enables mankind to escape the natural, tormenting fear that causes men and women to feel hopeless. This kind of fear produces “reverential awe, respect, admiration, adoration, devotion, and worship.” Solomon writes about it in Proverbs 9:10 -11 (Amplified) “The (reverent) fear of the Lord (that is, worshiping Him and regarding Him as truly Awesome) is the beginning and the preeminent part of wisdom (its starting point and its essence). And the knowledge of the Holy One is understanding and spiritual insight.”

The 2017 CBA conference is a little over five weeks away. The Lord has been speaking to Annette and me about His awesome holiness and the need to gain spiritual insight in (our conference theme) “This Day and This Hour”. 

Hey Captain

ESD is a very real hazard in ANY marina, pool or private dock with electric service. The hazard is increased in older marinas with older boats and most of all with fresh water. On Lake Erie this season ESD claimed the life of one family's son. The family was visiting a modern marina with a newer boat. The family dog jumped in the water. The dog began to struggle, unable to swim effectively. The father jumped in to help the dog but was unable to help the dog or himself move the few feet back to safety. One son jumped into the water to help the dad then the second son responded all experiencing the same inability to make their muscles do what the brain was commanding. A fellow boater recognized the tragedy unfolding and shouted to the wife to disconnect the shore power. With the shore power disconnected the family dog, the dad and one son got out of the water but one son succumbed to ESD.

My home marina now has signs at the entrance to every pier with this warning.

ELECTRIC SHOCK DROWNING (ESD) HAZARD

Rescuing an ESD Victim

- Know how to distinguish ESD from drowning
- Don't enter the water


- Call for help – 911 or VHF Channel 16
- Turn off shore power connection
- Get victim out of the water. Reach, throw, row but don't go in!
- If person is not breathing, use CPR until emergency personnel arrive

I remember a man jumping into the water to save a little bird that fell out of a nest built in a boats anchor. I remember Brenda, walking back to our boat at night. Hearing a noise close to the pier she responded to help a child that fell off a boat. The parents were a few boats away visiting with friends.

A few weeks ago two ladies managed to turn their dinghy, with them in it, upside down in high winds at the end of my neighbors' boat. All these had happy endings but what is next? If ESD is involved will I respond correctly? How about you?





Journey for Sale



The 51 foot Colvin custom designed steel schooner, Journey, was built by Daniel L. Stoner in 1985. Home port is Sandusky, Ohio and is stored at Sandusky Harbor Marina where she can be inspected. It has been used as a Passenger vessel and certified by the USCG (# 939100) through June 2016. Most recently, the Journey was the centerpiece of the B-About Sail Ministry.



Hull is a steel displacement type with keel and skeg rudder, Hull No. INZ083088018,. The Load Length Waterline is 41 ft; beam 13.9 ft, and draft is 5 ft. Registered depth is 8.1 ft and displacement is 23 ton. Fuel is diesel with capacity of 81 gallons. Power is 120v AC and 12 v DC. Fresh water capacity of 300 gallons and holding tank of 100 gallons.

The steel hull stem is curved with moderate flair and the transom is slightly rounded with the tumble home design. Hull-to-deck joint is welded and the superstructure is steel with venting cabin windows. There are two rows of lifelines, stainless steel bow rail, welded steel toe rails and scuppers from the cockpit and decks that drain overboard. Deck lines are yacht braid. Interior is wood with one head port forward.

Propulsion is Detroit Diesel 3-71N, 3 cylinders inline, 113 hp. Cooling system is a closed fresh water reservoir with heat exchanger and raw water cooled exhausts. Fuel tank under the salon sole.

Steering system is hydraulic. VHF – West Marine Zephyr; Uniden UM 380; West Marine VHF 500. Garmin GPS Map 498 and 6-inch Ritchie Compass.

Safety Equipment (USCG Approved): Six Type 1 PDFs for Children and 20 Type 1 PDFs for Adults; 7 throwable cushions and 4 throwable life rings; fire extinguishers; flare kits; bell; FCC license. Twelve person life raft with strobe; bilge water alarm; manual whale pump fire extinguishing system; three first aid kits and a life sling. Aft bilge pumps are manual whale type.

Steel masts with wooden booms and sails for Jib, Fore and Main. Includes fairly new sail covers for all sails

A marine survey was last conducted May 10, 2014 by Waters Edge Marine Survey, LLC from Sandusky, Ohio. The overall vessel rating was “Above Average” and based on the BUC Used Boat Price Guide, the Fair Market Value was established at \$105,600 in May 2014.

The untimely death of the captain in early 2016 has kept the Journey in dry storage since the Fall 2015 to current. Camp Patmos (www.camppatmos.com) of Kelleys Island has clear title to the schooner and desires to sell quickly. No reasonable offer will be refused. Contact Gary L. Because of the constantly recurring recessions in this unstable world, the funds have to be made down on the field. It will be very miserable, if one bargains in the lack of the funds the ship condition and the crew safety. Every year, ships and people there go under the waves.

We still pray for 1. Fiji for tuna fishing, marketing right to Japan. A long-line-fishing vessel is needed. 2. For the mission boats the Mission Marina, the home-base as the boat harbour on Penhryn, Cook Islands.
