Blue Water Surrender joined and supported Titus International Ministry this past January, along with Camp Rio Dulce. The camp is composed of all the Rio Dulce Churches regardless of their denomination.


The camp is in a remote village called Creek Cuatro Cayos, located behind Cayo Largo in the Golfete. Three hundred children from the region came to this annual event, along with 50 adults made up of Pastors and leaders to supervise. The pastor wives prepared food. Those who participated were transported daily by water from 17 different villages, and returned to their villages at night for safety since the camp does not have sleeping quarters. The children came and experienced the love of Jesus through activities-worship, games, Bible study, story telling from the Gospel, arts and crafts, and food!

This is what is happening on the water today! Blue Water Surrender has founded Casa Agua Azul as a safe home for children on the shore of Lake Izabal in Ensenda, Guatemala. Our mission started when the Gordon family set sail on a Voyage of Faith in 2007. Relations were established as we waited out hurricane season before heading to explore Central America and into the South Pacific.

God has a plan, which he is faithful to fulfill. We encourage you to step out in faith and actively join in the dream God has placed within you from before the beginning of time.

BLESSING OF THE FLEET

ISLAMORADA, FLORIDA Report by Marlin Simon

On January 1, 2019, Marlin Simon, along with three other ministers, took part in this year's Blessing of the Fleet in Islamorada, Florida. "About one hundred boats were blessed this year," said Marlin.



The boats, which are made up of all kinds and sizes go out to the head of Whale Harbor Channel and then file in one at a time. "As they approach the bridge, they radio in the name of their vessel, the captain's name, and any special prayer requests they may have," said Marlin. "In turn, we bless each boat and their crew."



Although none of these pictures reveal the number of boats that participated in the Blessing of the fleet this year in Islamorada, Marlin shared that the line of boats went on for a couple of hours! "It was really special."



Marlin participates in blessing the boats every year not only as pastor of Spirit and Truth Ministries Church, but also as a Christian Boater's Association member. "I wear my CBA shirt and hat," said Marlin. "I would really like to encourage other CBA'ers to institute a Blessing of the Fleets in your areas at appropriate times during the year. It would be great to see as many pastors and CBA members as possible get involved with this wonderful ministry in each of your communities."



HAITI / ISRAEL ADVENTURES



The short version on this particular adventure to Haiti began when I received a phone call from Ray Bideaux's wife, Kathy. The tone of her voice said, "My husband could use your help."

Ray was returning from an aborted attempt to make the long passage along the Cuban coast by way of the old Bahama channel. By the time Captain Terry, Elijah, and I arrived in Marathon as a substitute crew, at least most of his woes were under control.

There was a particular experience on the approach to the Ile-a-vache. We were heading north when large Squalls hit. The compass said NORTH, but the GPS said EAST. It was a tense moment there! After many serious debates as to why we were moving so slowly, we discovered upon arrival that the propeller had not been fully cleaned. I would like to meet with the diver... PAID IN FULL!

We delivered much needed supplies to Ile-a-vache-- Haiti, including generators, water makers, and real sails for their native boats. The sails were a lot better than the flour sacks they had been using! This was all sponsored by Islander Evangelical Missions.

Our return to the U.S. was another adventure. Haiti was in the aftermath of a long coup. (President Ouster). O Kaye is one of the largest cities in the country. But there is no electricity and no water in the whole city. We had to stay there to meet transportation out of the country. We missed the boat that was going to take us back to the States.

I recently returned from another trip to Haiti with Ray. Those of us involved in this mission feel that this is a "God-called" mission that we will continue to be involved with. For you who may not know, Ray Bideaux is a missionary evangelist, sailboat captain, and master diving instructor. He and his wife live in Les Cayes, Haiti. He is president of Ministeres Evangelique des Isles.



At this time I am installing new keelbolts in the "Sunshine Too". We made a great videotape at https://youtu.be/RDGuSK7K9ZE. Please watch it because I think the Haiti trip will be tacked onto it. I used the voyage to check out Elijah, a potential crew member for Israel. I believe he will do fine. At this time we have other possible crew members as well.

As far as our May/June departure- I met with Captain Brad Whipple briefly last night. It was a meeting orchestrated by God! Brad left for Puerto Rico this morning to help deliver a vessel. Please pray with us for God's timing on the Aliyah mission. The departure for trans-Atlantic must be May/June 2019 if we are going to make it this year. At this present time this is our goal. HOW GREAT IS OUR GOD

God has protected us and our boat "Jubilee" in incredible ways. One such incident began one evening when Sue mentioned to Mike that she wanted to "REVIEW" some boat emergency procedures. Mike decided that the first and most important to immediately address would be "smoke or fire aboard". We spent the next thirty minutes reviewing the emergency procedures we would take in situations dealing with smoke or fire detection.

The following morning our alarm went off as usual. We awoke and immediately smelled something burning - like an electrical fire. Sue was closest to the door and saw smoke in the main cabin. She called out, "We've got smoke and this is not a drill." Because the emergency "REVIEW" was fresh in our minds, we calmly went through and accomplished what we could do aboard the boat in a situation that involved visible smoke, but no visible fire. With smoke increasing, we looked but saw no evidence of the exact source of the smoke. We then took care of the "take off-board" procedures. We notified our first neighbor (Efte - former Cyprus Olympic team sailor) who is normally aboard his boat every day from sunup to sundown. The dock manager (Stathis) was having coffee with him at that very moment!! They are both well-versed in handling these kinds of situations and ran to assist. As you can imagine, the dock manager's worst nightmare is smoke/fire on one of the boats in the marina.

Within forty-five minutes the smoke had cleared enough to investigate. There was still no apparent sign of the source of the smoke. And we weren't able to spend very much time in the cabin because of the lingering smoke. It was puzzling. But it was clear that the emergency was over. We waited for the smoke to clear and for the marine electrician to arrive. A few minutes later, however, a couple of friends here, father and son (Dino and Adonis), who have done a project or two for us, stopped by to see if we were okay (small marina in a small village - word travels fast). Adonis was able to crawl into a space that we hadn't completely investigated (Oh, to be 30 again!!). He found the culprit! One of the lithium batteries for our electric bikes had cooked off!

Our Father God is AWESOME! We had JUST gone over the safety procedures, so we were prepared. Our minds were fresh in knowing what to do. Second, the alarm clock woke us before the smell of smoke did, which provided us additional time to get out before the smoke got too bad. We had smoke detectors and checked them regularly - fresh batteries. We were puzzled as to why they didn't they go off. Perhaps it was because they were old — new ones forthcoming! Third, it was during normal work hours so marina staff was able to immediately assist. Fourth, it was a sunny, calm day so we could throw open every port light, hatch, window, and door. Fifth, we were able to immediately reach the marine electrician who was on his way (not a small feat in Cyprus). It turned out we were able to stop him before he made the trip here because we found the actual source of the smoke. Sixth, there was not a boat problem! Seventh - and this one is really big - while there was a very minor amount of damage to Jubilee, there was no good (natural) reason why the situation stopped before we found the problem, There were 2 batteries side by side yet the second one didn't explode or cause a large conflagration. It didn't spread to nearby combustible materials, etc. When the locals came by to help, they saw the melted and charred battery, adjacent toolbox, and floorboard under the battery. They couldn't imagine how it didn't spread. We were able to give them an extremely plausible explanation — and at least one of them agreed - "MIRACLE". Our Great Father God covers us and protects us in so many ways - even when we don't see it! Love and blessings, Mike & Sue Wernette
